Dial-a-service 899433

If you are not able to access the Benefice Sunday services via the internet, then it is now possible to dial in and to listen to the service at any time during the week. It's the cost of a local call and very simple to do. Put the kettle on, find a comfy chair, and dial 899433.

You will first hear a recorded voice with an American accent welcoming you to the service, then be asked to wait a moment. There might be a bit of a pause as the service recording uploads (15-20 seconds).

Unprecedented - a reflection from Revd Keith Albans

We may only be in July, but I think we already know the three words which will fight it out for Word of the Year 2020. One is Pandemic, the second is Zoom and the third is Unprecedented! Returning from Sabbatical I had expected a few things to have changed, but to discover that the whole practice of Church and Ministry has altered beyond recognition was never in the plan. But I am grateful to everyone who has worked so hard to make up the new ways of being and working – I hope it won't take me too long to work out what they are.

In my Grapevine letter back in March I said that my plans for the Sabbatical had changed somewhat – and of course they changed again because of lockdown. But I did manage to do some reading (I particularly recommend 'Wintering' by

Katherine May (Rider, 2020) which has a lot to say to our current situation) and some walking, and I was delighted to complete the inaugural Barley Rise Estate Half Marathon. Many thanks to all who sponsored me. The total raised for St Leonard's Hospice is now over £3000.

Having been on Sabbatical it seems only reasonable to recognise that part of what we are experiencing now has a similar feel. We have not stopped being who we are, but we have had to face up to not doing what we usually do. After all, as many have said, the Church has not shut, it is simply that our buildings (partially) have. But the oft-repeated call that we "must not simply go back to where we were but look for a new normal" is a challenging one which may bring out the ostrich in all of us! As people of faith we

constantly live with the tension between the words of Jesus about not putting new wine in old wineskins, and the words of Jeremiah to "Stand at the crossroads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way lies; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls." Looking ahead we will need to be honest with each other about those new ways of working which we have actually found beneficial, and which we should retain at least for a

while, just as much as we share our pain and frustration about the things we have missed deeply.



As you know, the four parish churches are open at various times during the week for private prayer, and you are encouraged to come, sit and enjoy the peace of our beautiful buildings. Perhaps this is an opportunity to explore them in new ways.

The decision has been taken not to hold Sunday services until at least September, in light of the ongoing risk and the viability of public worship, and the success of our online services each Sunday (in the past month alone our Youtube channel has had over 1,800 views, amounting to over 16,700 minutes watched, across the country and as far as South Africa).

However, as they tend to be smaller and more manageable services, Morning Prayer will be said in each of our four churches at 9am during the week (Monday, Holtby; Tuesday, Warthill; Wednesday, Stockton; Thursday, Dunnington). All are welcome to these services which usually lasts about 25 minutes. An order of service is provided which can then be taken home.


