

<u>You will need</u>

- 2 cupcake liners
- Glue/Tape
- Pipe cleaner
- Scissors
- Paper
- Marker Pens
- 1. Fold one cupcake liner in half, then half again to make the angel's body
- 2. Flatten another one and cut two triangles out of it for the wings.
- 3. Glue the wings onto the back of the folded cupcake liner.
- 4. Cut a circle out of the paper for the angel's face and add detail using marker pens then glue at the top of the body.
- 5. Twist the pipe cleaner into a halo shape and attach to the back of the head with tape.
