I have a monthly knitting magazine which I always look forward to receiving. The November edition included the first part of a pattern to knit a Nordic blanket. Having visited Norway a couple of times I was once again attracted to the Nordic designs included in the blanket and thought I would have a go.

I gathered together some of the wools from my stash and others I went out to buy, before lockdown, and then the project began. There were many different designs, some in single colours, some with two colours and some that had recognizable images within them.

Over the next four months more designs were included until the final magazine came which included instructions on how to finish the blanket. I knew then I had done the right thing in ordering wool to do the edging as this completes the blanket.

At the start of the project there was a selection of different coloured wools on the sofa, but now there is a blanket I am proud of on the sofa. This reminded me that each one of us is different, each one of us have different gifts and talents. Individually we would, and many of us have, found life very difficult during this pandemic. The communities we live in have been able to support



each other and as we move towards the end of lockdown we will once again be able to share and enjoy each other's gifts.

Jesus calls each one of us to serve him, which we can do as individuals but when we come together we can do so much more to share his love with those around us. It is that fellowship together that we are looking forward to.
