The Present

That HRH Prince Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh, died at 9:00am on the 9th of the month on the 99th day of the year aged 99 probably means absolutely nothing, but it is an interesting anomaly of time.

I have a propensity to become obsessed with time. If I am excited about something imminent, I want time to go quickly, counting down the remaining number of sleeps until it arrives. If I am on holiday, I want time to



go slowly, so that it feels like I have more time to enjoy it. I am either thinking about speeding up or slowing down time. It can be likened to taking a train ride, spending the whole time thinking about the destination, the point of arrival at the station, at the expense of cherishing each present moment of the journey with all its twists, turns and surprises along the way. Maybe that is why it is called the present. Each moment of life is a gift.

The Bible has much to say about time and not least about the importance of dwelling in the present moment, whatever the circumstances. The only thing that separates us from God, we who seek Him, is our awareness in the present moment of His presence. The Psalmist asks, 'Who shall stand in His Holy place?' (24:3) which is a trick question, since all we need to do is open our eyes to see that we are already standing in His presence in each present moment. God's gift of Himself to us.

Witnessing HRH, the Queen, sitting alone in St George's Chapel at Windsor Castle last Saturday at the funeral of her dearly beloved, was poignant and brought a tear to my eye. It seemed to capture a moment in time that was profoundly symbolic of all that has happened to us living in the shadow of a pandemic this past year. I hope with all my heart that in that very moment she knew God's presence with her.

And so, it reminded me of the ending of one of my favourite poems, 'The Station' by Robert J. Hastings.

'Stop pacing the aisles and counting the miles. Instead, climb more mountains, eat more ice-cream, go barefoot oftener, swim more rivers, watch more sunsets, laugh more and cry less. Life must be lived as we go along. The station will come soon enough.'
