Acts 1.15-17, 21-26

a reflection by Revd Nick Bird

This passage from the Acts of the Apostles just has to be one of my favourites – it makes me both wonder and smile. Judas has done his thing and is now dead (did he hang himself, or did he 'burst open in the middle [of a field] and all his bowels gushed out', as we are told here?) Either way, Judas was one of the twelve chosen disciples, and being a full team of twelve was important as they represented the number of the *Tribes of Israel*. And now they are a man down.

Sitting on the substitution bench was a small group on which to call, who had to have been part of the wider team since the baptism of John up until the ascension. It looks as though the pool to choose from was small (Barsabbas and Matthias). But there was no vote, no election, no interviews, no hustings. To decide between the two they cast lots — in effect they left the decision to God (or chance, depending on your viewpoint).

This is fantastic, and the reason this passage makes me smile. The earliest and biggest decision to be made by the nascent church was done by drawing straws or rolling dice. If this is not a biblical injunction as to how all major church council decisions should be made, I don't know what is!

But what of Barsabbas and Matthias? Can we imagine them having followed Jesus around for three years, looking at the appointed Twelve with their bickering, floundering, failing, denying and betraying, and themselves thinking, 'He could have chosen me'? And then, with the casting of lots, Barsabbas still missed out. Would there have been disappointment or relief? Was martyrdom narrowly dodged?

Perhaps we are fortunate not to be able to see the 'big picture', and don't know when a rejection turns into a blessing, chance becomes providence, failure becomes success, or when the last will be first. If only life were so tidy, so organised. All we can do is to do that which is given us to do, and wonder and smile.
