A reflection from Revd Mark Poole

The Holly and the Ivy

The season of Advent has begun. It is a time of waiting, anticipation and hope. We mark this time with Advent calendars, Christmas trees, garlands and twinkly lights; we make 'to do' lists, shop, for food and presents; we (hopefully) gather for parties, carols and concerts. All joyful stuff. But life gets busier, which can potentially rob us of the gift that the season of Advent has to give. That is, space to pause each day, to be still, just for a moment, maybe even as you open a window on your Advent calendar (you are never too old for an Advent Calendar!) And in a moment of prayer listen. Listen to our own inner voice. Listen to the still, small voice of God that dwells within each of us. Allow the wonder and the mystery of the incarnation to sink deep into our hearts and souls. God with us. And in my experience, this can lead us to an encounter that is transformative, because it connects us with ourselves and with God.

And this connection is at the heart of Advent and the Christmas event it anticipates. God became one with us in the life of Jesus Christ connecting heaven and earth. The truth is that God is earthed, rooted and grounded in human lived experience – yours and mine, all its joys and all its messy bits too.

So here is a thought to kick start your advent reflection. This theme of connection is symbolised in the evergreen leaves of the holly and the ivy. They remind us of the eternal, unchanging love of God for each of us and the promise of resurrection life. Ivy usually grows up some form of physical support: it has to rely on another to grow. How are you showing your gratitude to those you rely on and how are you showing others that they can rely on you too?

God bless you in your journey through Advent.


