A New Song?

a reflection by Revd Mark Poole

Dear Friends,

My heart is warmed and my spirit thankful when I hear that people I know are finally being vaccinated against Covid-19. Set this against the backdrop of spring flowers rising from the depths of the earth and bursting forth in a fanfare of dazzling beauty, accompanied by the birds singing sweetly in the trees and I could possibly be forgiven for feeling like singing 'The Hills Are Alive with The Sound of Music' at the top of my voice!

As winter melts into Spring, maybe, just maybe, the lamentations of lockdown will morph into a chorus of celebration birthing for us all, in the words of the Psalmist, a 'new song in



my mouth.' (Psalm 40 verse 3). And the song will be new, as the addition of 'new normal' to our everyday vocabulary testifies. And the song should be new, for I am sure we have all had cause to reflect on the positive changes a pandemic has brought locally and globally. So why do the strings strumming in my soul sound discordant?

I have read that an unprecedented global scientific effort has led to the development of a number of coronavirus vaccines, which promise to help the world's most vulnerable from the devastating disease. A perfect prelude to any new song. In collaboration like never witnessed, teams across the world worked concurrently on multiple stages of development condensing ten years' laboratory experiments into less than twelve months. Again, these are melodies that are music to my ears. Governments have pledged that vaccines will be available to those who most need them, not just to those who can afford to buy them. Harmonies are blending perfectly. Although governments in high-income countries have placed massive orders for multiple vaccines, the World Health Organisation has introduced Covax - a scheme to ensure vulnerable people in low and middle income countries also receive supplies. Yes! These are the kind of lyrics I want to sing from the hills until my voice is hoarse!

But then, the buried news item that brought dissonance to the whole musical score. So far, 95% of all vaccinations have taken place in just ten countries and only two low and middle income countries have even begun immunisation programmes. I pray that justice, love and fairness will be the overtures of the new song before it is too late and all that remains are the old dirges.
