A reflection on the Baptism of Christ, by Judith Hewitt

During Advent we read of the teachings of John the Baptist encouraging the people to repent and be baptized in preparation for the coming of Christ. We then had the birth of Christ and this coming Sunday we remember his baptism, which many see as the start of his public ministry.



In the Church of England we usually think of baptism as the welcome of a baby or young child into the church family, followed by Confirmation when we are old enough to make the promises our god-parents made on our behalf, and to publicly proclaim that we are a Christian and want to follow and trust Jesus.

For many other Christian denominations baptism is for adults and would be total immersion. This might take place in a river or in a special pool in a church. As you step slowly into the water your journey faith would begin. You would be guided and held by possibly two people as you fall back into the arms of another. At that point you must have complete trust in that person.

It is that complete trust God wants us to have in him. It is also that complete trust Jesus had in His heavenly Father and was shown when the Holy Spirit descended on him as a dove and the words 'You are my Son, the Beloved, with you I am well pleased.'


At St Nicholas Church we are fortunate to have both the space and some experience of doing this.
