A reflection from Revd Canon Nick Bird on John 20.19-31

Friends,

When dead people with holes in them appear in the midst of lockdown party, it's probably just as well that they reintroduce themselves with the words, 'Peace be with you'.

Our gospel story for today is the encounter between Jesus and his disciples on the evening of that first Easter. His followers are terrified ("They did it to Jesus, will they come and get us next?"), but one is missing – Thomas. We read this passage at other times, especially on Thomas' feast day, and we then often talk about 'doubt' and 'faith'. But this is a post resurrection story, and our focus is not on the disciples, but on the crucified Christ who has overcome death, burst out of the tomb, and somehow joined them in a locked house. The disciples' response? They 'rejoiced when they saw the Lord', which, frankly, may be one of the great biblical understatements.

In times of fear, distrust, darkness and loss, Jesus appears. In times of anxiety, doubt, threat and disorientation, Jesus appears. He doesn't arrive with an explanation, or even a solution to the predicaments in which we find themselves, but his presence seems to be everything. His presence brings trust, and trust, as this gospel says, brings life.

We risk a spiritual glibness in saying this. If I was writing from the dark basement of bombed out district of Mariupol, Ukraine, my words might be a little more convincing, rather than the safety of Yorkshire. But I wonder whether the gospel call we hear is one not simply to embrace faith, but life itself; to believe in life, to trust in light beyond the darkness? We don't need much hope to get us through, but we do need some. Whilst the world may seem all Good Friday and Golgotha at the moment, we are Easter people, and so even in fear and darkness, we sing Alleluia and watch for the dawn.
