### A reflection on Christian Aid Week from Revd Dr John Schofield



Starting on 15th May we have Christian Aid week. This year's tagline is "Turning hunger into hope". Today's emphasis is on climate change and the effects of the war in Ukraine will have on the lives of those on the margins. Climate change has almost disappeared from the news now-a-days, and is further down many politicians' agenda, but the flooding, fires, and less consistent weather is affecting the food supply in countries where there were problems in food distribution exacerbated by Covid-19. Fuel price rises mean more than more expensive heating for many; higher transport costs mean everything is getting more expensive as it needs to be moved from where it is produced to where people live. That is not just for manufactured goods, but for the basics of food also. Farmers' costs are rising and so the prices they have to charge for their crops is too. And then much of Africa obtains its grain from Ukraine and Russia. There will be severe shortages as crops are not being planted now for next year because of the fighting. Christian Aid directs its money and efforts through projects on the ground and through local partners in the places where people are most vulnerable.
