A reflection from Rev Dr John Schofield

Friends,

I have heard many people say they would have liked to have been alive in Jesus' days and hear him preach. They say this thinking they would have responded positively to his oratory. But in Luke 6 we have 4 blessings and 4 woes which are hard to hear and apply to ourselves. Jesus tells us we are blessed if we are: poor, hungry, crying and hated; and woe to us if we are: financially OK, have had food, happy and laughing, and people say good things about us. That puts the vast majority of us, and the people we know, in the bad category, and the ones who are looked upon favourably by Jesus and God, in situations we would not want to be in.

These are challenging words. They are designed to shake us out of complacency. Would we, like the rich young ruler who was directed to give away his riches to the poor (Luke 18:18–30), then become sad? Following Jesus is not for the faint hearted! What, then, should we do to shake off complacency and be changed people, as we are directed to change the world despite our desire to be liked, well-fed, happy and not poor?
