Mary Anoints Jesus - A reflection from Revd Mark Poole



I enjoyed a real treat last Friday night! I went to see Archbishop Holgate's School production of 'Matilda,' courtesy of a Golden Ticket given to me by two of the Re-Ignite youth members, Alex and Declan. The show was absolutely superb in every way – the backstage and production team, the orchestra, the actors, and singers all gave a first-class performance, it was brilliant! The best school show I have ever seen! (Sincere apologies to my own children!)

Like many fairy tales, the story of Matilda is a triumph of good overcoming evil and celebrates authenticity, courage, generosity, and selflessness, all in the name of the common denominator of most treasured fairy tales, and that is love. Such stories exercise our imagination and set out a vision for us all to live within. These themes are not a million miles away from this Sunday's Gospel reading from John, where Mary anoints Jesus.

Mary, the woman who had listened deeply to Jesus, who recognised the profound value and timing of Christ's presence, courageously sacrificed her money and reputation in an act of extravagant generosity towards Jesus. She broke an alabaster jar of expensive perfume, poured it onto Jesus' feet and then wiped them with her hair. It was an authentic gesture of passionate adoration, love and service. Discipleship calls us to love God with renewed heart and mind and soul and strength which finds expression in walking authentically with the needy, selflessly lifting up the weak in love, generously feeding the poor, and striving courageously for justice. This is the vision we are called to live within. A life lived in and through His extravagant grace, mercy, compassion and love. So, let's get on the stage of life, and by the power of the dazzling light of Christ sing and dance the show-stopping good news of the gospel for all to see! That the resurrection love of God conquers everything. Alleluia!
