A reflection from Revd Nick Bird - Transfiguration



Friends,

Our gospel reading today (Luke 9.28-36) has Jesus transfigured, but does it leave us transformed? On top of the mountain, in the presence of two of the 'greats' of the Old Testament (Moses and Elijah), and three of the yet-to-be greats of the New Testament (Peter, James and John), Jesus lets his mask slip. The divinity of Jesus begins, literally, to shine out of him. He is transfigured.

Perhaps it was the elevation, or maybe it was the company, or possibly it was the conversation about Jesus' Jerusalem departure (or 'exodus' – fancy having that in common with Moses) that lightened the mood so much. Jesus, this god-man, incarnated deity, finds his 'veiled in flesh the Godhead' now is being seen, transfigured, made into something even more beautiful. Hidden under surface skin, there is supernaturalism just leaking out of the man.

We could leave this story on the page, but that would be sad. In a sense this is not simply about Jesus 'godding things up' for the crowd; small, and partially dead though it is. This is not simply humanity hiding divinity, this is also about our own 'divinization'. Jesus became mortal that we might become immortal. Jesus became human that we might become divine. The transfiguration is not simply the thing that happens to Jesus; it is the direction of travel for all who draw near to God. The story is not something for us to only observe, but is something in which we partake. Embrace your humanity, but do not deny your divinity. The mountain awaits all who draw near to God.
