Re-Ignite Adult Supervisor required

Our marvellous youth group, ably led by Thom and Grace at St Nicholas, require an adult to fulfill supervisory requirements. This person will need to undertake the leadership safeguarding training and get an enhanced DBS certificate (all organised by the Diocese). If you think this is something that you could offer once a month on the 4th Sunday evening, please see Carole or Judith. We ask for your prayers that someone will feel God's call to offer this vital service.

Maundy Thursday service. I have always found the service on Maundy Thursday evening to be a powerful experience. The liturgy re-creates the events that unfolded between Jesus and his disciples on the night before he died. It Includes the image of the servanthood of Christ as the priest washes the feet of volunteer parishioners. Then after Holy Communion - the recollection of the Last Supper - all the decorative hangings are removed from the church and the lights are dimmed, evoking the sombre nature of the occasion. The service ends in silence.

A blessed priest wafer (the Host) is fitted into a device called a 'monstrance' and is placed on the Lady Chapel altar as a focus for contemplation. Those who attend the service may decide to leave the church in silence after the service ends, or there is the opportunity to remain and sit in the Lady Chapel in the presence of the Host for a period of silent contemplation and prayer as we anticipate the awful events of Good Friday and what Jesus endured for our sakes. The church will remain open for about an hour after the service ends.
