
Children's Newsletter


Prayer Corner

Cardboard Rainmaker Instrument

You will need

Cardboard tube
Dried beans or rice
Tape
White paper
Felt pens/crayons/paint

- 1. Secure one end of the cardboard tube with tape.
- 2. Half fill the tube with dried beans or rice and seal the other end with tape.
- 3. Cover the tube in white paper, ready for decorating.
- 4. Colour or paint your decoration on the outside of the tube. Alternatively use decorative tape to create a pattern.



Spring flower spotter


