You will need:

Blue,green, red & yellow paper 2 Lollipop sticks


Glue




- 1. Cut out a yellow paper triangle and a red paper semi-circle.
- 2. Glue (or tape) one lollipop stick to the bottom of the yellow triangle and the top of the semi-circle, leaving a gap in the middle of the shapes.
- 3. Glue the second lollipop stick to the bottom of the first one to create a handle.
- 4. Using a quarter of the sheet of blue paper cut out a wave shape and stick onto the sheet of green paper.
- 5. Cut another quarter of the blue paper into a wave shape and lay on top of the other wave, folding under the edges and securing with tape to form a pocket shape.
- 6. Now the little boat can slide up and through the pocket so that it can move freely on the waves.
