Pentecost Windmill

You will need:

Template (page 2 of the newsletter)

Colouring pens/pencils

Scissors

Wooden dowel or pencil

Drawing pin

Sticky tape



1. Cut out the template along the dotted lines and colour on both sides.
2. Fold the small circles at the end of the sails in to meet the circle in the middle of the pin wheel.
3. Carefully push the drawing pin through all the small circles at the centre.
4. Place the dowel (or pencil) behind the pinwheel and push the drawing pin into it. Don't push it in too tightly or the pinwheel won't spin.
5. If the pin comes through the back of the dowel, cover with tape so it is not sharp.
