Paper plate sheep twirler

You will need:

- Paper plate
- Black card
- Black wool or string
- Scissors
- Glue
- Googly eyes or scrap of white paper
- Sticky tape



1. Cut a spiral shape into the paper plate.
2. Tape a piece of wool to the back of the centre of the spiral (middle of the plate).
3. Cut a sheep's face out of the black paper and glue to the centre of the plate.
4. Stick on some googly eyes or cut out some eyes from white paper and add eyeballs using a black pen.
5. Finally cut out some legs from the black card and add to your sheep.
