Origami Bunny corner bookmark


#### You will need:

Square piece of paper
Googly eyes
White paper
Black felt pen
Glue



- 1. Fold the paper diagonally (both ways), then unfold.
- 2. Fold into a triangle and then fold down the top of one side of the paper to the bottom of the triangle.
- 3. Fold the left and right corner towards the bottom centre of the triangle.


  Crease and unfold.



- 4. Next fold both corners to the top of the triangle and crease well.
- 5. Tuck both tops inside the pocket.
- 6. Add ears, eyes, nose and teeth to complete your rabbit.
