This year's resources from The Church of England are similar to last year's 'rhythm of life' – featuring habits and patterns which help us grow as disciples of Christ day by day, especially as we prepare to celebrate the great mystery of God's saving love at Easter. During Lent, the booklet reflections will be centered around a summary of the Christian Way from Common Worship, which identifies six activities essential to our calling as disciples.

Each week a different contributor will explore a different aspect of Christian discipleship –worshipping together, praying, exploring the Bible, sharing communion, offering service and sharing the good news with others.

A parallel 40-day challenge for families and children will also be available -exploring the life-giving habit of generosity in partnership with 40 acts. There is a daily reflection booklet for adults and a daily challenge booklet for families. Kath has one copy of each for people to look at, but if you could register your interest, we would order them in bulk.

The Benefice Prayer Group will meet on Tuesday February 10th at 7pm at Fair View, Warthill YO19 5XW to pray for the needs of the Benefice and our communities and the needs of the world.
