I wonder how many times you have said the Lord's Prayer. Do you say it without thinking about the words? The words are so familiar that we say them almost by rote as we would say our times table.

The words are in the memory of someone with any form of memory loss or someone who is dying, so much so that the words 'Our Father' triggers their brain to allow them to join in. So important to those sitting with them.

I would like to suggest you pray a line at a time very slowly and see what our heavenly Father is saying to you.

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power, and the glory
for ever and ever.
Amen.

We are also offering a wafer, intincted, in a separate chalice, by the priest. If you wish to receive an intincted wafer, please take an orange card (at St Nicholas) from the chancel steps and take it when you receive Communion. The practice may vary slightly depending on the celebrant.
