A reflection on Acts 16.20-end from Revd Canon Nick Bird



Our apostolic heroes are once again thrown into prison for causing trouble. After casting out a spirit from a slave-girl, and the ensuing loss of income for her owners as her fortune-telling powers also depart, they stir up the crowd against the disciples. Once they are given a severe beating and then banged up, Paul and Silas are not perturbed, but rather sing God's praises. In a wry moment, St Luke writes, 'About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them'. I wonder whether the other prisoners listened to them with the same sense of joy that neighbours would listen to a drunken, late-night student party? Once again, the disciples are disturbing the peace.

However, their earth-shattering late night karaoke, seems to do the trick, though, and an earthquake shakes open all the doors and their chains are loosed. They do not choose freedom, though, and instead give themselves up to the jailer, saving him from a fate worse than their own. He takes them into his home, feeds them and washes their wounds. And through this interplay of suffering, a miracle, freedom and self-restraint, this guard recognises that, though these men have nothing, they still have something he needs – the source of salvation and ultimate liberation.

We can not always choose our circumstances, or control outcomes, but we can pray and praise in any situation, whether it seems to warrant it or not, and to welcome the power of God, demonstrated in the most unlikely of events. Whatever we are experiencing, there are those around us who need us to bring Christ to them. The greatest treasure we carry is the one inside of us, and the greatest freedom we have is to posses Christ, and to be possessed by him.
