Reflection on Luke 9.51-end by Revd Canon Nick Bird

This gospel passage is a pivotal text, with Jesus literally turning to 'set his face to go to Jerusalem'. From here to the Passion narratives, the running theme is hospitality (both good and bad – Good Samaritan, two meals with Pharisees, Prodigal son, Rich man and Lazarus, Zacchaeus, etc). But underlying all this is the gospel notion of the reception or rejection of Jesus.

Our gospel account today is both funny and awful! A couple of the disciples are keen to call down fire on the village, á la Elijah (2 Kings 1), and in the very next chapter we discover that 'wiping dust off your sandals' will do!

Another theme arising here is the urgency of discipleship. Bury your father? Finish ploughing? Follow whilst there is an opportunity. Looking back? Walk away from your past? Well, refer back to another Old Testament figure, Elisha, who eats his yolk of twelve oxen, which was the agricultural equivalent of burning one's boat.

For Luke the gospel writer, hospitality is a major theme, indicating that this is a key spiritual practice for Christians. 'Tolerance', however, is not a Christian principle. Tolerance is the acceptance that there is your space and there is my space, and we shall respect that, but keep separate. We shall tolerate your presence, but keep you on the outside. Hospitality, though, is a key Christian value. It is the principle of accommodating the other into one's space, of making room, and changing that space to welcome someone in. In fact, good hospitality is having a space and an attitude ready prepared in order to receive the other – like having an internal guest room.

This is a practical outworking of the Christian faith, but it is also a spiritual practice. All hospitality is training for us to welcome Christ. We create an inner space into which God is welcomed, and God does the same in welcoming us. So let's ask ourselves, how can we, individually and corporately, demonstrate the hospitality of God? What can our churches do that might be new and different and daring to create that space?

Be mindful that in the sacrament of bread and wine, firstly we give thanks ('Eucharist'), and then we allow ourselves to be guests. For at this meal it is God who is host. God welcomes us, and Christ calls us, with urgency, to follow him as disciples.
